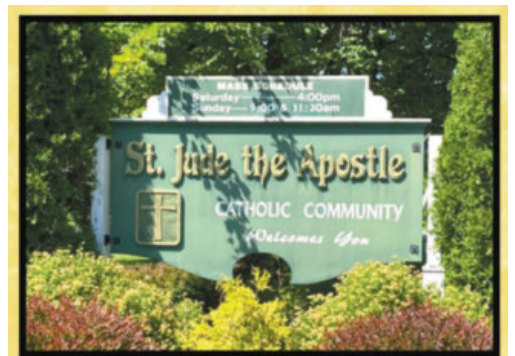

PENTECOST



This week the Feast of Pentecost has a lot to teach us about being disciples of Christ. We are all deficient in our ability to follow Him. But, in Christ all things are possible, He promised that he would provide us with everything we need to be able to follow Him. Today we celebrate the single most important gift that we will ever receive. The gift of the Holy Spirit, the giver of life, who not only gave birth to the Church on this day, but at our baptism, transforms each one of us into a new creation and endows us with new life.

On Pentecost the Spirit came upon each of the Apostles with tongues of fire, causing them to proclaim the mighty acts of God with divine power to transcend and overcome the diversity of language and culture that divided the people. He gathered them into the Church and gave them the power to unite all people in one faith, one baptism and one Lord. He gave them a mission to baptize all nations and gather all the faithful into the body of Christ.

This outpouring of God's spirit endows each one of us with a share in the divine life of Christ and fills us all spiritual gifts, which enable us to grow in that life. The Spirit fills us with Christ's love and strengthens us to be able to live as children of God.

In the kingdom of God, we all have a unique gift to be shared in the mission of Christ, but we are also deficient and dependant on others for the other things that are essential to that mission. When we gather and share our gifts with each other, we come to the full stature of Christ's body. As His body on earth, we are able to accomplish amazing things through His Spirit. The Apostles were able to preach with such authority that thousands would be converted in a single day. They were able to readily heal the sick by calling on the name of Jesus.

On the feast of Pentecost, we celebrate this outpouring of the Spirit giving birth to the Church. We also celebrate the outpouring of the Spirit in our present day that gives us this same new life at our baptism and strengthens us in our confirmation. We celebrate the work of the Spirit who endows us with gifts that empower us for a unique and essential role in the mission of Christ. Also, we are reminded that work of the Spirit in all of these gifts is to gather the nations, to unite us in a common faith in the one Lord.

In this common faith we are reborn, and as children of God we foster the gifts of the spirit within us and avoid the desires of our flesh. When we live by the Spirit, we experience the abundance of life that Christ intends for each of us. Yet that abundance of life is found not in solitude, rather it is found in our full participation in His body. It's found when we gather together in His name to pray and worship our God. It's found in sharing our gifts in the mission to bring the Gospel to all nations.

Today, when miraculous healings are not so evident, and we don't see large numbers of people being converted by the power of our preaching, we might think that we don't have those same gifts that were given to the early church. But think of the number of people who receive healing when we are gathered together to pray through the prayer chain. And think of how many people are healed when we welcome and show unconditional acceptance to others in our lives.

Finally, think of all the people whose lives are touched and their courses altered when they are struck by the example of someone who shows faithfulness, love, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, peace and self-control. These are the fruits of our lives when we try to live by the spirit. Let them be shown through us.

Opening Prayer

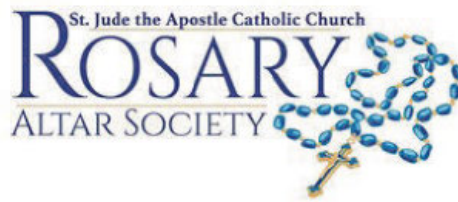
