GOSPEL REFLECTION, ADORATION and MINISTRIES

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In our daily lives, most people never give any thought at all to the urgency of Christ returning again to judge us. Frankly, after 2000 years of waiting we have good reason to assume that the second coming will not happen within our lifetimes.

But it hasn't always been this way. We know from the earliest writings in Christian history that the first Christians believed that Christ was coming right back. Jesus himself said, "truly, this generation will not pass away before these things take place." So, St. Paul, Matthew, Mark and all the early writers wrote about it.

Now as time went on and it became apparent that Jesus wasn't coming right back, disappointment and doubt began to set it. Many people wondered if Christ was going to come back at all. So, for all those who were losing heart, Matthew gives us the parable of the ten virgins specifically to encourage us to stay vigilant.

No one knows the day or the hour that these things will happen, so we need to keep faithful and be ready for that day. There have been many people who have tried to predict the time of the return, but those predictions have all come and gone without it coming to pass.

This parable warns us that if we are not prepared then we will be shut out of the kingdom and Jesus will say to us that He never knew us. We are encouraged today to renew our commitment to live out our faith in Christ and follow the commandments he gave us. In doing that we will find that Christ come to us frequently in the daily activities and events of our lives. He is in the poor or the sick that we give help and comfort. He is in the hug of a little child and the smile of and elderly widow.

There is no reason for us to be disappointed or weary of keeping vigil for Christ because if we are living our faith, he is everywhere around us. So, let us hold fast to the words of St. Paul today that we are a people of hope whose destiny is to be with Christ in the end whether or not we live to see His return.
