

In Today's Gospel we continue to hear Jesus describing the Kingdom of God and our participation in it through the parable of the vineyard. This is a very dynamic parable that speaks to us in a very real way.

If we take time to meditate on this passage, we might be able to identify with those in the passage. Sometimes we are the obedient servants who do the work of the land owner. Sometimes we are the tenants who cause injury to others; whether it is physical, verbal, emotional, or mental injury. Sometimes we reject the cornerstone and sometimes we embrace the cornerstone.

This passage is not a condemnation of ourselves, rather it calls us to be aware of ourselves; our words, actions, and thoughts. It also calls us to be aware of the loving presence of God in our lives. Recently we heard the parable in which Jesus calls us to forgive "77 times." Jesus calls us to do this because God first forgives us, loves us, and grants us mercy. When we fully co-operate with God we are aware of God's infinite forgiveness, love, and mercy. When we reject and do not co-operate with God's will we should also be aware of God's infinite forgiveness, love, and mercy. God is present to us in every moment of our lives. When we experience God's love and those days that we feel so distant from God's love.

Brothers and sisters, as we awake each day let us pray as St. Paul did, that we may embrace and co-operate with the cornerstone working for what is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, and gracious for all people, for the glory of God. In other of words, may we participate in the vineyard the way God calls us.
