

Thank you Mr. Charlie!!!



## **GOSPEL REFLECTION, ADORATION and MINISTRIES**

### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's readings encourage us to think about our belief in the invitation of Jesus and especially our response. The readings give us an image of God's kingdom that is like a great wedding banquet. At this banquet we will be given the richest foods and the choices wines. It will be time of great rejoicing and celebration of the Lord's victory over sadness and death.

In the gospel, Jesus gives us a parable that is speaking about both His present time when He establishes the kingdom of God on earth and of things to come as we are told of how the people will respond to the King's invitation to the feast. The king repeatedly sends his servants to the people that He first invited to the banquet. They are met first with the simple refusal, and then the responses get increasingly harsh as they go from indifference to violent treatment of the servants. This part of the parable is speaking of the disciple's mission to the Jews inviting them to come to the kingdom of God, which Jesus had established.

Then the King in his anger sends troops to destroy their city and tells his servants to go into the streets and invite anyone else they can find.

This foreshadows of the coming destruction of Jerusalem and the disciples turning of their mission toward the gentiles. The gentiles are those who will accept the invitation of God and enter the great banquet of the Lord. Yet here we come to the puzzling part of the story. The gentiles were the group who were gathered from people in the streets both bad and good. They were not expecting to go to a wedding feast and so they were unprepared, but they were invited anyway. So, why would the King expect people to be dressed for a wedding, and why would he throw out the person who did not have a wedding garment?

Could it be that the King expected proper dress because he provided it to the guests? That would make sense because the person could have

refused the garment the king provided to make it possible for him to enter the banquet.

This is true for all of us today who also have been invited to share in the great banquet of the Lord. We too must accept what God provides to make it possible for us to enter the kingdom. We must put on Christ by welcoming a change of heart and leaving behind our preoccupation with worldly ways.

Following God's ways means we must enter into the mission of Christ, conforming our lives to His Word, loving God and our neighbors. So, today, we ask ourselves, what is the measure of our belief? How have we responded to the invitation? Have we accepted all that God requires of us to remain at the feast?

May God's peace be with you all!


