Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings this week might cause us to wonder if we really understand what Jesus meant in asking us to lose our life. Today we have the examples of three different men all who wanted do God's will but who reacted to God in very different ways.

Peter had just come to realize who Jesus was, when he made his confession that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. So, Jesus began to teach him about what kind of a savior he would be. He would bring salvation through suffering and giving his life for our sakes. But Peter didn't get the idea of this kind of a savior at all. He was looking for a savior who would restore Israel to its former glory with great power from above. He wanted Israel's enemies to do the suffering, not God's own son.

Jeremiah also had been going through some suffering of his own as he was mocked and hated and even imprisoned for the prophecy that God gave him to announce. He was losing heart in following God's will, feeling duped, because he given nothing but death and destruction to proclaim to his people. God had yet to give him words of restoration and new life to proclaim. But Jeremiah persisted in following God's will, because of the fire that God had placed within him.

Finally, Paul is the one who fully got the idea of 'giving up our life for another'. He built on what Jesus taught, that we think not as God does but as humans do. He tells us to "be transformed by the renewal of our minds;" To let the seed of Jesus' teaching take root and grow within us so that we may be transformed to the likeness of Christ.

'Giving up our life' means to strive each day to become more like Christ. To serve our families, our communities, and our parish, in such a way that our lives are poured out for others, one drop of blood at a time.

Becoming Christ for others, is difficult. We will be misunderstood, laughed at, rejected and abused, an even today, people still die for their faith in Christ. There is little doubt we too will sometimes lose heart, and we will want to avoid letting go of the things in our lives that have to die, so that new life in Christ can come about.

So, let it be our prayer that, like Jeremiah, will be filled with the fire of God's Spirit that we too will be faithful to the will of God for us, and we will persevere through all the little deaths that we will suffer to make room for resurrection in our lives.

Jan-Pro Cleaning Systems — for stripping and waxing all of the classroom and hallway floors. They look brand new and shiny!!!


Brightvision Window Cleaning — to clean the inside & outside of all the windows in the building.
