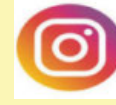

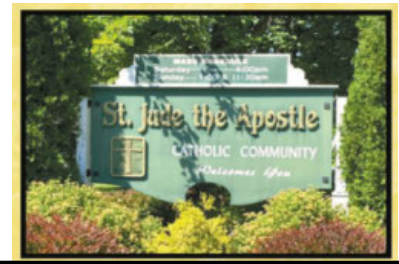
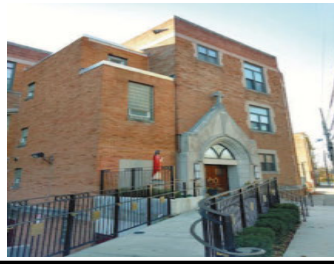

Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week the readings take up the most prominent theme in the entire ministry of Jesus. If fact, forgiveness is so central to Jesus' teaching that it comprises nearly 2/3's of His message. Yet it's not surprising that Jesus concentrated so heavily on forgiveness, because reconciliation is the reason that He came. He reveals to us the true nature of God who, as the psalmist tells us is "rich in kindness and mercy", and He does not repay us, with what we truly deserve. Paul tells us in the second reading, that we who are reconciled through Christ are not living for ourselves, but we are living for Christ. So, we are called to bring this same reconciliation to others. Paul makes His point in the midst of a dispute between Jewish and Gentile Christians. Even though some in Paul's community may be weaker or stronger in faith, we are all one body in Christ. We should be supportive of those who might be weaker than others and we are to avoid scrupulous criticism of one another. So, if we are the servants of God through Christ, bearing His compassion and mercy, we can see what a problem it is if we ourselves are not forgiving and merciful. God forgives us without hesitation and the one requirement He has, is that we show the same compassion and mercy for others. This brings us to the question of Peter in today's Gospel' "How many times must I forgive my brother". He thought he was being generous by suggesting 7 times, because in Hebrew tradition a person was required to forgive the one who sins against them only 3 times. But, Jesus, replies that we must forgive 77 times, meaning that there is no limit to the number of times we must forgive those who sin against us. This teaching on forgiveness comes right at the end of the passage we heard last week about correcting an erring brother or sister. Matthew's intention in this context is that even though we may sometimes need to correct one another, we must always be ready to reconcile and welcome back someone who may have caused us some injury. So, it is no accident that the lectionary takes up this message today and even extends it with the passage from Paul who warns against scrupulous criticism of one another. Matthews Gospel goes on to give us a parable on this theme of our need to forgive, and there are some things in the parable that I would like to point out. First, is the difference in magnitude of what we owe God compared to the reparation that we might be owed from someone who sinned against us; the debt we owe God is far greater then any debt we may be owed. Second, when the servant demands payment of the debt He is owed even after His own debt had been forgiven, his behavior we are told, affected the whole community. It is His fellow servants who complain about it to the King. So, contrary to the intent of the King that His spirit of mercy and forgiveness would be passed on, instead what happened was, the servant's retribution, begets more retribution. Finally, of greatest importance, is the judgment this servant brings upon himself for the huge debt that he owed because he did not show mercy for the small debt that was owed to him. That is how God will treat those who do not forgive. I think Paul says it well in His letter to James, "Merciless is the law on those who have not shown mercy" So, how do we go about granting forgiveness from the heart? We can start with a prayer, that God will show us every place where we still harbor contempt or hatred of another because of some injury we received from them? Then, we have to make an effort to change our hearts toward those persons and in some way try to show it.

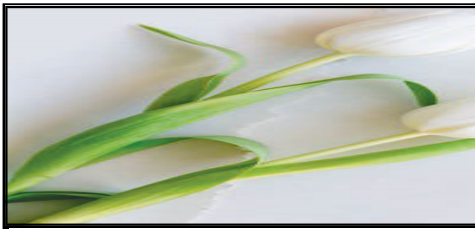

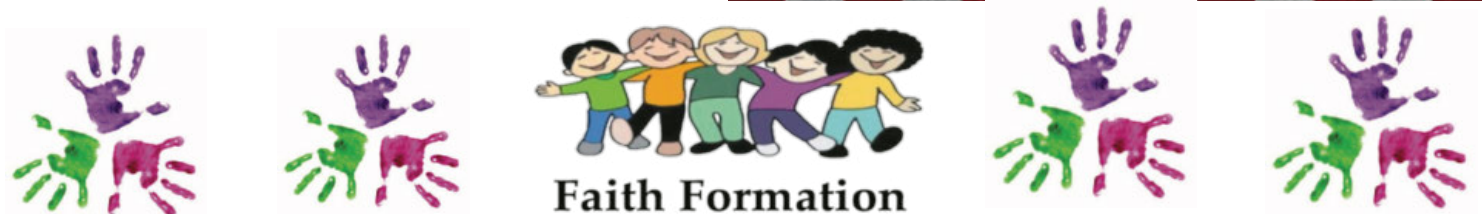
RESPECT LIFE


