

GOSPEL REFLECTION

This Sunday we are confronted with Jesus likening himself to a vine and we, His followers, are the branches of the vine. His command to us is that we are to remain in Him and He in us. If we do that, we will bear much fruit. His followers who do not remain and bear fruit will be cut off.

So, how do we remain in Him and He in us? This answer is given to us clearly in the second reading this week. We are to belong to the truth and Jesus is that truth. We are to believe in Him and we are to be doers of His word and keep His commandments.

Jesus gave his disciples and his church a new commandment. We are to love each other with the same kind of love He showed. We are to pay it forward. To treat people like God has treated us. To treat people like we want to be treated. That is how we glorify God. How he showed us to glorify and grow His church.

Now, if we are to love as God loves, that love begins with forgiveness. Often, in our human nature, we lack the ability to forgive as completely as God forgives. He said he will remember our sins no more, but we don't so easily forget. We tend to still hold something back. We tend to want some sort of comeuppance. We are reluctant to restore trust in someone who has broken our trust.

Second, we are to act with humility, to befriend those who others would avoid. Remember how Jesus would care for the leper, how he would minister to the Samaritans when Jews were to shun these people. We too are to associate with the lowly, to take the lesser place at table so as to not seek to exalt ourselves.

Third, we are to Serve others as Jesus has shown us. Just as He washed the feet of others, we too are to become servants. We are to care for the needs of those around us. We are to bring about that kingdom of God where suffering is relieved. We are to feed the hungry, comfort and care for the sick and mourning and cloth those who have none.

This is how we remain in Jesus. This is how we bear the fruits of His kingdom, by carrying out His work in the world, by loving with His love; paying forward the love He has for us.

So, today I would like to end this homily with an appeal. Lately, with prices rising all around us, the need to share what we have with others has never been greater. These rising prices are hurting everyone, but the people hurt the most are those in need in our community. Please, consider if you can, picking up a few things for the local food pantry we support. This is one of the ways we can come to be known for the love we show in Christ. Let it be so for us. God Bless, Deacon Warren
