



GOSPEL REFLECTION

This Holy night as we celebrate the Easter Vigil we witness as our Elect receive the fullness of all the gifts of the Kingdom of God. Receiving the sacraments of initiation, they become children of God and children of the promise of resurrection into new life sustained in God's steadfast love.

In baptism, our Elect promise before God to begin a new life by rejecting evil, embracing our faith and sharing in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Tonight, we all are called to reflect on these same promises in our own lives and renew our own commitment to walk in newness of life.

The Easter Vigil liturgy is for me the highest of all of our worship because it is on this night that we recount the witness of God's saving action in our lives, and in the lives of all of the faithful before us. We witness this continued blessing in the lives of our new brothers and sisters that we welcome this night. It is in this liturgy that we connect the resurrection of Jesus with the resurrection going on in our own lives through God's saving action.

The Gospel today recounts the discovery of the empty tomb where they had laid the body of Jesus. It had been


discovered first by the women who had gone to prepare His body, but instead found a young man in a dazzling white robe who said to them, 'You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified, He has been raised, he is not here.' The women went off to tell Peter and the other disciples, but Peter did not believe it. He had to go and see for himself. We hear of God's tremendous power in bringing forth life from the waters of the Abyss. This life, human life, he made the greatest of all creation because we are created in His own image and given dominion over all creation.

Next, we recount the Exodus where God saved Israel from slavery through the great parting of the Red Sea. His beloved people were able to pass through the waters safely, while the Egyptians would perish in their pursuit.

Then we hear Isaiah tell how God espouses us in His steadfast love and how, even though we stray, He longs to receive us back. God invites us all to heed His call, to listen and turn from evil ways and come to the great banquet. Come and listen, His word will not fail in the purpose for which he sent it.

Ezekiel proclaims how God takes us back, proving His holiness; He puts within us a new heart and a new Spirit that enables us to walk faithfully in His word. Finally, we come to the epistle to the Romans where Paul's words connect this witness of God's saving acts with the resurrection of Jesus, and with our own lives. It is how we experience the risen Lord.

In baptism, we die to the worldly desires in our lives and begin a new life, living as children of God, resurrected from our former selves. We undergo a conversion of heart that continues throughout our entire lives. We struggle daily to die to ourselves and rise to new life as God's children.



That's how we know in our hearts of Jesus resurrection by reflecting on the saving power of the risen Christ in our own lives. We remember all the ways He has changed our hearts and has given us a new Spirit. The same Spirit of Almighty God that brought new life out of nothing remains with us through every hardship and every obstacle that we encounter, even destroying the

power that death holds over us.

It's our confidence in God's steadfast love for us that brings the scriptures and ritual of this liturgy alive for us, showing the saving action of God, still giving life, still delivering from slavery, and still caring for us as His beloved.

So, as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord this Easter, let us also remember our baptismal promises and walk joy-fully in the new life we have been given.

May God Bless you all this Easter

The resurrection of Jesus is the central event of our Christian faith. If it did not happen, then we cannot rise with Him. If it did not happen, we should go home and find something else to believe in. But thank God that it did happen, that Peter and many other witnesses can attest to it; and that further witness later came in the disciple's experience of the risen Christ in their lives.
