GOSPEL REFLECTION

his Sunday we are nearing the end of the Easter So, for all of us who He chose to share in His mission season. We have just celebrated Ascension Thursday where Jesus was taken up to the Father, and now we look forward to celebrating Pentecost

next week where Jesus empowers His disciples to begin their mission. So, this Sunday's readings are all about preparing for that mission and waiting for the Holy Spirit to come.

Today's Gospel recalls the priestly prayer that Jesus prayed for his disciples in the upper room just before He gave himself to suffer for our sake. He knew that he was sending

them on a dangerous mission, into a world where they too would be rejected and suffer for the sake of the Gospel. So, he prayed for their unity, for strengthening and protection from God to carry out their mission.

Listen again to the final words Jesus prayed for them, "As you sent me into the world, so I send them into the world and I consecrate myself for them, so that they also may be concentrated in the truth "

Jesus consecrates himself to become Eucharist for us, yet we might ask, what did He mean when he asked the Father to "consecrate them in the truth"?

If we look up the meaning of the word 'consecrate', it means, to be set apart and to be made sacred for the service of the God, or to devote oneself entirely to the service of God.

So, when Jesus said he consecrated himself for us, and then he was referring to his sacrifice for us; to be set apart as the Lamb of God who gave his life entirely for our sake.

Now, having said that, He gave His life so that we also will be concentrated in the truth. He meant that we too are to be set apart to love and serve of God and He sends us the Holy Spirit at our baptism for just that reason. In fact, the Gospel today is filled with this language, that the disciples are set apart and 'not of this world'.

on earth, Jesus' prayer is that we will be devoted to this mission and that God will unite us and protect us form every evil we encounter in carrying it out.



In the first reading today, we have a story from Acts which tells of how the disciples were gathered together in the upper room while waiting and preparing to embark on this mission. Part of that preparation was to call forward a new leader who would serve in the place of Judas as one of the twelve Apostles of the new Israel that they would establish.

We learn from this reading what was of greatest importance in selecting the new Apostle. There was no mention of education or intelligence or any inquiry into their leadership qualities, there was only a requirement for their commitment to have remained with Christ through His whole ministry on earth, both during His human life and after the resurrection because they were chosen as witnesses. Then, most importantly, they consulted God for the final decision.

That's what God asks of all of us, who are set apart for serving Him; that we commit ourselves to remain in Him, and that we prayerfully discern and 'say yes' to our vocation. We all have a purpose in God's kingdom and that purpose is as unique as we are. God had our vocation to love and serve Him in mind, when He created each one of us.

So, if we knowingly turn away from our calling to share in His mission, then neither can we expect to receive the protection and strengthening that Jesus prayed for. But, if we listen to God and 'say yes' to the calling that he gives us, then He will bless and multiply our efforts. We will share in the mission to open the eyes of others; and will, in turn, open the eyes of still others...

Though we will still have to suffer in this world, the Lord will guard and strengthen us to persevere and remain in Him, and we receive unimaginable blessings when, at the end of our journey, we come to share in His Glory.
