
# ST. JUDE THE APOSTLE SCHOOL




It was another wonderful year of enriching our experience with our faith and community. We always look forward to the next season together.

## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

The celebration of Trinity Sunday gives us some insight about how we should understand who God is. Rather than asking you to think about God as three persons while still one God, I am going to ask you to understand the Trinity from another point of view. Often, we can better understand God using our hearts instead of our heads.

Today's first reading tells us about the wondrous things that God has done and reminds us of just how unintelligible God is for us. We cannot define God in human terms because that would limit God; and we know God is without limits.

If we resist our temptation to define God, our human nature does not let us trust in what we do not understand, and we are left with the problem of faith. So, God in His wisdom, gives us a way to understand Him without defining Him.

So how did God do this? He reveals Himself to us is in relationship. It is through the love that a father has for His son that God reveals Himself to us. So much more telling of what we need to know about God, than His height, weight or age, He connects with our innermost need.

Even as sophisticated as we are today, we cannot categorize, define or predict God, though we do connect with God in our deepest selves. This family bond is the way we know God.

Now, the amazing thing about the Trinity is how WE fit into the family. The Holy Spirit reaches out to us as a result of our baptism and adopts us as God's own sons and daughters.

This gift of God, through the Holy Spirit, allows us to share in His image. Yet, each one of us is unique and irreplaceable in His eyes.

Each time we celebrate the Eucharist there is silent prayer that is said while preparing the cup. It goes like this, "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in Christ's divinity, who humbled Himself to share in our Humanity." So, as often as we share in Christ's body and blood we are renewed in our relationship with Him.

God takes us as His own, even though we were not His own, and His Spirit bears witness within us. Because of this, we too must witness to God in our lives and share in the mission to baptize all in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Just, as the scripture this Sunday so clearly states, we have God's love poured into us through the Holy Spirit. Therefore, as his children we are to share that love with those around us. We should do our best to let our lives be guided by that same Spirit.

So, each day, if we ask ourselves, "Who are we?", we should not be afraid to define ourselves by our relationship to God. This is the witness of our adoption. God Bless,



Dear Parishioners of St. Jude the Apostle:

On behalf the Finance Committee, the Pastoral Council, Fr. Rice, Dcn. Warren and Trustee Chris Harris, we wish to share with you a brief overview of our current financial condition. The table below summarizes our income statement as of February 2024.

## St. Jude the Apostle Church Income Statement Year to Date (YTD) as of February 2024

Overall, our financial condition is *NEUTRAL*. It is neither good nor bad. Here are several observations:

The offertory is down from our budgeted forecast by about -\$7k.

Other income and fundraising sources have off-set this variance in the offertory; there are significant one-time donations included in this category. We cannot assume the same level of fundraising year-to-year.

Expenses are running favorable to budget, which helps off-set income deficits

The finance committee continues to review our expenses and evaluate opportunities to mitigate The arrears repayment plan to the Diocese has been temporarily paused pending resolution of bankruptcy proceedings

There are capital improvements we are evaluating and prioritizing based on need and restricted uses of Re-Igniting Our Faith funds

In summary, you can help! The most significant thing you can do is to help grow our parish community through your active participation. A vibrant, active parish community will attract new members and spur growth. Finally, you can offer your unique talents / gifts to helping our parish.
