WHO WAS ST. VALENTINE?

St. Valentine is the patron saint of lovers, people with epilepsy, and beekeepers, among other things, but the real-life history of the man is unknown. There are various legends about a Christian figure named Valentine or Valentinus who was martyred on February 14 in the 3rd century AD.

In one story, St. Valentine was a Roman priest and physician who refused to convert to paganism and was executed by Emperor Claudius II in about 270 AD. Prior to his execution, he miraculously healed the daughter of his jailer.

In another story, St. Valentine was executed because he secretly performed weddings for soldiers, who were forbidden to marry according to an edict from Claudius II.





It is customary in the month of February to concentrate on a healthy heart. Heart disease remains the number one cause of death in both men and women. It is important to keep track of our numbers: Blood pressure, heart rate, weight, cholesterol levels-all contribute to our heart health. Heart disease is also genetic-if our parents had heart disease, it increases our risk. Annual physical exams are a good way to start knowing your numbers. Don't hesitate to see your primary at least once a year.

Roman Catholic Diocese of Albany Office of the Bishop

January 24, 2025

My dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

May I take this opportunity to address concerns shared over the change of administration in Washington, D.C., particularly regarding immigration. As the Diocese develops guidelines for parishes to follow, I want to encourage all to remain firm in our Catholic faith, sharing the love of Christ by building hope, rather than perpetuating fear.

Though some words and actions reported thus far may have been intemperate, provocative, and even cruel in their import, our words and behavior as Christians must always bear witness to a loving, merciful, and life-affirming God, who is Father of us all. That can be challenging, but Christ did not back down when faced with a challenge. He moved forward, lovingly, and He calls us to do the same.

We will continue to provide humanitarian services to anyone who is in trouble. The Catholic Health Association, US Conference of Catholic Bishops and Catholic Charities released a joint statement this week, pointing to the many ministries of our church, including our diocese. Catholics are working daily to feed, house, heal, educate, and meet people's needs, affirming that our church recognizes that all people are conceived with inherent dignity, reflecting the image of God, and that dignity is not dependent on a person's citizenship or immigration status.

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops which speaks on behalf of myself and all U.S. Bishops, makes an important point on the politics involved. Archbishop Timothy Broglio, USCCB president, said, "the Catholic Church is not aligned with any political party, and neither is the bishops' conference. No matter who occupies the White House or holds the majority on Capitol Hill, the Church's teachings remain unchanged. It is our hope that the leadership of our Country will reconsider those actions which disregard not only the human dignity of a few, but of us all."

And Bishop Mark Seitz, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Migration, said, "Church teaching recognizes a country's right and responsibility to promote public order, safety, and security through well-regulated borders and just limits on immigration. However, as shepherds, we cannot abide injustice, and we stress that national self-interest does not justify policies with consequences that are contrary to the moral law."

Please know that my prayers are with us all and our diocese as we move forward together. I pray that each of us can remain a pilgrim of hope, remembering as Romans 5:5 says, "hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts." May we find the strength, as a church, to let His love pour out of us in all that we say and do.

Dear Parishioners,

The US Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI), established in 1911, is a nongovernmental, not-for-profit international organization dedicated to addressing the needs of refugees and immigrants. USCRI, working through 8 field offices, (including a field office in Albany), provides legal, social, and health services to refugees, unaccompanied migrating children, trafficking survivors, and other immigrants in all 50 states.

The USCRI Albany field office has been welcoming refugees to Albany, New York since 2005. All refugees are legally vetted and approved for resettlement; they come primarily from Afghanistan, Burma, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Iraq, and Syria. Newly arrived refugees receive services including housing placement, cultural orientation, school enrollment, coordination of initial health appointments, referrals to ESL classes, employment preparation and placement.

The President's Executive Order, (EO 14169), Reevaluating and Realigning USA Foreign Aid, suspended all refugee resettlement programs as of January 24, 2025, and effected staff from all field offices are laid off.

To provide immediate relief to the 48 families (146 individuals) already in the resettlement program, the Albany USCRI field office is urgently seeking donations of gift cards (VISA, Walmart, Hannaford, Price Chopper etc.), which will be distributed to those in greatest need. Among the most at-risk individuals are:

- single mother with five children from Burma/Myanmar
- A single mother with a disabled child from Afghanistan
- An elderly couple from Iraq
- A single woman from Nicaragua
- Multiple families from Afghanistan who are here on special immigrant visas (SIV) which means that they were
 particularly helpful to the US government in Afghanistan.
- As well as families from Sudan, Iraq, Yemen, Syria, Burma/Myanmar, the Democratic Republic of Congo, all places
 plagued by unending wars and violence.

Please pray that the government completes assessment of our country's foreign aid programs, and restores funding where needed and effective.

Thank you for considering helping the USCRI Field office with resettling those 146 recently arrived legal immigrants, following the teachings and example of Jesus, to love and care for our neighbors. Please place gift cards in an envelope marked "USCRI Refugees" and leave with the office, or place in collection basket at Mass, we will bring these to the local USCRI office.
