



JUBILEE 2025

The 2025 Jubilee Year officially began on December 24, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This symbolic rite, performed by the Pope, marks the beginning of the Jubilee period and invites all the faithful to enter a time of grace and spiritual renewal and will end on the Epiphany 2026. The Jubilee is a special year of grace, in which the Catholic Church offers the faithful the opportunity to ask for a plenary indulgence.

A parish nurse is a graduate of an accredited School of Nursing, currently registered in New York State who is active in their faith and has a spiritual commitment to serve others as Christ did. Responsibilities include collaboration with the pastor, other nurses and ministries, coordinating health education programs, assisting individual parishioners with educational needs or referral information. A parish nurse does NOT do hands on care but rather serves as a health resource to the parish. I chair the Homebound Ministry, making initial home visits to those requesting holy communion at home and then assigning an extraordinary minister to visit regularly with communion and prayer. Dear St Michael's Parishioners,

Thank you sincerely for your always generous contributions to our Social Justice Ministry collections each year. The agencies we support are so very grateful. Sadly, the need in our neighborhoods is significant; in both the cities of Troy and Rensselaer, the child poverty rate hovers at 20%.

Here is how you have helped others this past year:

- Hygiene items and underwear for Veteran's served by the Stratton VA. This facility serves veterans in the North East corridor, and we were told they supply as much as \$4,000 monthly of these items.
- 54 Easter Baskets from St Michael's, and 75 Easter Baskets from LaSalle families were donated to Circles of Mercy in Rensselaer, an organization founded by the Sisters of Mercy. These were distributed to children in the City of Rensselaer
- Baby supplies for Catholic Charities Community Maternity Services, they have ongoing needs for diapers, wipes, toiletries. The Crafty Ladies contributed dozens of beautiful handmade knit or crocheted blankets, booties, hats, sweaters, and toys.
- Back to school supplies for children served by Catholic Charities Agencies, Roarke Center in Troy and CoNSERNS U in Rensselaer
- 60 complete Turkey dinners for families associated with the Carroll Hill school in Troy
- Over 200 gifts from our Giving Tree to Roarke Center, CoNSERNS U, female inmates at the County Jail for their children, and local veterans

Additionally, parishioners supported our parish outreach collections, the Parish Council 'poor box', the monthly food collection for local pantries, and the charitable work of our Faith Formation families. Also, our several ministries, and individuals, provide opportunities for charitable works and giving. It is a blessing to witness this wonderful generosity!

We know the amount of 'asking for help' seems overwhelming; everyone is not expected to contribute to every thing asked of us! Just contribute if and when you can, to causes that are important to you. We are following Jesus's many relevant teachings, sharing in His loving ministry to the poor.
