

Choir FAQ's 🎵

Q. Do I have to know how to read music in order to sing in the choir?

A. No. It is not required that you know how to read music.

Q. Do I have to be able to sing in Polish or Latin to be in the choir?

A. No. Anything in foreign languages will be rehearsed so that you will feel comfortable in any language.

Q. Do I have to come to every rehearsal in order to sing in the choir?

A. No. Many of the choir have other obligations which cause a conflict on rehearsal night.

Q. When does the choir rehearse?

A. The choir rehearses on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 p.m. When preparing for special masses choir rehearses weekly.

Q. Do I have to have a really good voice to sing in the choir?

A. No. All are welcome in the choir. The intentions of the heart are more important than the beauty of the voice.

Q. Do I have to audition to be in the choir?

A. No. The choir is not auditioned. All you have to do is come to rehearsal.

Q. What does the choir do?

A. The choir serves as leaders for the assembly in singing hymns and parts of the mass. The choir prepares and sings special music used in Eucharistic and healing masses, feast days, and communion meditations..

Q. Is there an age limit for singing in the choir?

A. Young adults (high school age) through centenarians are welcome to sing with the choir.

Q. Is the choir right for me?

A. There is only one way to find out! Come and join us any Tuesday for rehearsal. You may come to believe that **“all God’s children have a place in the choir.”**
