NOVENA TO ST. PEREGRINE Patron Saint to Those With Cancer May 1 through May 9, 12 Noon

Fr. Bob will be leading a nine-day novena to St. Peregrine at St. Stanislaus Church. St. Peregrine is the Patron Saint of those with cancer. The novena will be prayed for nine consecutive days:

- Monday, May 1—Friday, May 5 at 12 Noon Mass
- Saturday, May 6 at the Saturday 4 pm Mass
- Sunday, May 7 at the 9 am Mass
- Monday, May 8 through Tuesday, May 9 at 12 Noon Mass.

Envelopes for your intentions will be available at all of the entrances to the church and should be returned before May 1 to be placed on the altar during those masses.



St. Peregrine Feast Day, May 1

St. Peregrine was born in 1260 at Forli, Italy to an affluent family. He lived a comfortable life as a youth, and politically opposed the papacy. After he experiencd the forgiveness of St. Philip Benizi, he changed his life and joined the Servite order. He was ordained a priest, and later returned to his home to establish a Servite community. There he was widely known

for his preaching, penances, and counsel in the confessional. He was cured of cancer, after he received a vision of Christ on the cross reaching out His hand to touch his impaired limb. He died in 1345 and was canonized in 1726. He is the patron of cancer patients.

.RELIC OF ST. PEREGRINE

During this novena, Fr. Bob will also bless those in attendance with a first-class relic of St. Peregrine.

First-class relics are the earthly mortal remains of saints, and are classified as being sacred relics. These remains could be any part of the body, be it bone, flesh (either skin or organs), and even hair.

A **second class relic** differs from the first class, in that they are the possessions or tools that were owned or used by a saint during their lifetime. Items such as articles of clothing, vestments, jewelry, scepters, bibles, and hand tools, could all be considered to be second class relics, so long as they were used by a saint.

Third class relics are the only form of relic that the Church permits for sale. A third class relic is any item, new or old, that has made contact with the remains of a saint, or pressed against their tomb or reliquary; in other words a first class relic. This could include burial cloths that were used during their funeral process, the soil from which they were buried in, the remains of their casket, or newer items such as cloths, pendants, or mantillas, that have been blessed by God when placed against the first class relic. Third class relics are worn, carried, or kept in the home, for protection, divine guidance, and assistance from their patron saint.
