### PERPETUAL CARE

The meaning of Perpetual Care in our cemeteries is often a source of confusion for our parishioners and families

who have loved ones buried in our cemeteries. Below is the definition of Perpetual Care as defined by the Albany Diocesan Cemetery Board.

Cemetery care, also known as perpetual care, refers to the general maintenance of cemetery grounds, lots, graves, crypts, niches, community mausoleums, repair and maintenance of machinery and equipment, compensation of employees and maintaining necessary records of ownership and burials. Care does not include maintenance, preservation, or repair of memorials which remain the private property of the lot owner.

# St. Mary Magdalene July 22

Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was



present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels. It is believed she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did.

The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her. After this, she told several women she associated with and these women also became followers. Despite the scholarly dispute over her background, what she did in her subsequent life, after meeting Jesus, is much more significant. She was certainly a sinner whom Jesus saved, giving us an example of how no person is beyond the saving grace of God.

During Jesus' ministry, it is believed that Mary Magdalene followed him, part of a semi-permanent entourage who served Jesus and his Disciples. Mary likely watched the crucifixion from a distance along with the other women who followed Christ during His ministry. Mary was present when Christ rose from the dead, visiting his tomb to anoint his body only to find the stone rolled away and Christ, very much alive, sitting at the place they laid Him. She was the first witness to His resurrection.

After the death of Christ, a legend states that she remained among the early Christians. After fourteen years, she was allegedly put into a boat by Jews, along with several other saints of the early Church, and set adrift without sails or oars. The boat landed in southern France, where she spent the remaining years of her life living in solitude, in a cave.

St. Mary Magdalene's feast day is July 22. She is the patroness of converts, repentant sinners, sexual temptation, pharmacists, tanners and women, and many other places and causes.
